CRITERIA FOR ELIGIBILITY

- Program administrator from a California Public School District
- Administrative responsibility for three or more of the following services:
- Counseling, health services, school psychology, school social work, discipline (expulsions), special education, prevention and intervention, at-risk students, safe schools and drug-free schools or child welfare and attendance.
- County personnel are eligible if they have responsibility for three or more services listed above.
- Retired active members of CAPPA.



MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS
